„Entangled Histories of post-Mongol Eurasia“

The lecture will look at the literary production of Central Asian intellectuals in East Asia between the end of the Mongol empire and the beginning of the early modern period. Taking as a case study the reign period of Tuq Temür's (1328-1332) up until the end of the Yuan dynasty, the project looks at private writings and collections of literature in prose and verses produced by Central Asian intellectuals of various provenance. On the one hand, the lecture will show how 14th century Central Asian bureaucratic and religious elites shaped their networks, conversed with their Chinese peers, portrayed their own identity, and served the Yuan state. On the other, it will analyse the legacy and impact of the Mongol empire on the cultural production of the early modern period in East Asia.

Francesca Fiaschetti is Assistant Professor at the Department of History of the University of Vienna, where she has also founded and directs the Mongolia Cluster, a center for the promotion of Mongolian Studies. She has written extensively on the History of the Mongol Empire, history of the Yuan dynasty, cross-cultural contacts between East and Inner Asia and various aspects of medieval Eurasian history.
